

School PE and sport funding action plan REVIEW 2017-18





Issue	Action	Impact	Amount	OUTCOMES
Many children never have opportunities to ride a bike. Balance and coordination are poor. Previous provision has shown that the course increases coordination and confidence and so will be continued this year.	Provide Balanceability course for all Y1 children. We have a sports leader who has received training and will run this as part of her contract this year. We have to buy all equipment as previous provider supplied this last year.	Children improve their balance and co-ordination and have experience of riding a bike (with or without pedals according to their need). Extra lunchtime and after school FREE club is available for the whole year.	£6000 Purchase of our own balance bikes (6 x with pedals, 6 without). 6 bikes use in physical play area to enhance and continue provision outside of sessions. Salary for our own Sports leader (who is trained in bikeability and balanceability) to run sessions plus an after school club.	Balance ability bikes purchased. Children completed the year with improved gross motor skills including spatial awareness, coordination and balance. 94% of children reached the middle band of balance ability and met targets such as being able to lift their feet off the floor whilst braking and keeping the bike upright whilst turning a corner. 60% of the cohort reached the higher band and met targets such as being able to walk on the bike quickly and freely and in control and being able to glide in a straight line.
PE leader to enhance subject leadership skills and work alongside other leaders. So that she can effectively track and monitor provision.	Release time for co-ordinator to attend course/ monitor provision. Time to meet with other PE leads through network groups and plan and organise cross school events. Funding for transport and staffing for cross school activities/ competitions.	PE co-ordinators confident of provision in subject and able to manage and support staff. Children able to experience cross school events and competitions.	6 days cover = £1200 Transport and staffing cover costs = £800	PE co-ordinator has grown in confidence and knowledge over the year. Attended PE network group and organised cross school events and competitions. Healthy heart day enjoyed by all children across the school and active healthy lifestyles a high priority.
Many children with specific and complex needs to not access targeted sports and activity provision our children with specific and complex needs	Utilise expertise of WBA foundation to plan and delver weekly sessions for targeted pupils who find whole class PE sessions to demanding and cannot cope in a large group. Provide lunchtime club where they can be supported in extracurricular activities.	Children are accessioning a specifically designed PE curriculum that meets their needs. Their confidence and coordination increase and they are improving their basic skills at their individual level.	WBA foundation 0.5 days per week £1500	Children have accessed quality provision and made progress from individual starting points. Confidence and ability have grown and children have also attended many specific sporting events and competitions in conjunction with Albion One foundation for pupils with SEN. Transport has been provided for each sporting event to

				ensure all children could attend.
Children do not know how to initiate sports or games in outdoor play.	Employ a play leader to work with KS1 children to initiate and teach games and activities during lunchtimes	Games and activities are imitated and modelled leading to children being more active and being able to initiate games and activities by themselves.	£4000 Play leader 1.5 hours a day	Children are beginning to initiate games themselves after play leader has modelled. Specific children have been targeted to support play leader, this has encouraged good behaviour and provided these children with the opportunity to organise equipment and support other children's play. Gross motor skill have improved due to play equipment used during lunchtimes (scrap pack).
Children do not experience competition sport	Provide staffing and transport for children to be able to take part in sporting competitions with other schools	Children experience competition and are encouraged to set goals and be more active	£2000 – transport and subsidise staffing costs	Staffing and transport have been provided for all out of school competitions and activities. This has ensured that all children have been able to access this provision.
Children do not experience physical activity out of school hours	Provide a free sports club for KS1 after school – focus on a range of sports and ensure all KS1 children have the opportunity to attend a club	Children are introduced to a range of sporting activities and are more active	£3100	A range of sports clubs have been available to all children throughout the year and have been well attended. Clubs such as: golf, tennis, gymnastics, football and athletics have been available during the year.
