Phonics

Can you make an 'n' necklace? Use string or a strip of paper and add lots of things beginning with n. (These could be pictures or real objects, as long as they are small! Or you could even write the letter n lots of times and stick these on too) Then get a grown up to help you to put it on (make sure its not too tight!) and wear you 'n' necklace with pride!



English

Today we have a tricky challenge for you! We would like you to try and make your own book web, just like we have up in the Nursery! For this you'll need some story books and some wool or string (don't worry if you haven't any string, you can still do the activity) What you need to do is think about how different books can be linked together. Maybe they are books with animals in, maybe they are books by the same author or illustrator, maybe they are books with the same character in. However you choose to sort and link your books is up to you. You could then use the string to join the books that are linked together and lay out a web on the floor or you can just talk about the similarities and differences between books, any book talk is great!

Maths

This weekend we want you to talk about full and empty. You could do this through water play or in the bath, or even in the garden if the weather is nice enough. The important thing is to remember to use the language of full and empty to talk about containers while you play. Most children love water play and this is a great way to explore important mathematical language while having lots of fun!
