Reception Work to support your child at home PHONICS

Below are some examples of how you can support your child at home with their phonics knowledge.

Children learn best with daily practise and by repeating the learning.

This week we are going to practise sounds we have learnt and try and write some words using the sounds we know! Each day there will be a set of sound for you to practise saying, writing words and reading.

Did you remember all those sounds in set 1 and set 2?

Now see if you remember all the sounds in the next set.

Set 3 sounds

g, o, c, k

Say each sound in the words to help you read them.

Challenge - can you say each word in a sentence?

An even **bigger** challenge, can you write a sentence using each of the words you read?

- g tag, gag, gig, gap, nag, sag, gas, pig, dig
- o got, on, not, pot, top, dog, pop, God, Mog
- c can, cot, cop, cap, cat, cod
- k kid, kit, Kim, Ken

You need to practise these tricky words every day so that you can read and write them:-

the, to, I, go, no, he, she, we, me, be

Work to support your child at home- LITERACY


This week we are going to practise our handwriting! Each day there will be a set of letters for you to practise writing.

• On the next page you will find some letters from the 'line family'. Use the red dot and arrow to remind yourself where to start forming the letter. If you cannot print off this page, do not worry- ask your adult to draw lines in your book or a piece of paper and practise forming your letters there- remember to sit your letters on the line and keep practising the letters you find challenging!

The line family Start at the top and draw down to, or through, the line.		
L	start tall	
	a long line down to the line	
	flick and off	
í	a short line to the line	
	flick and off	
	and dot it	

t	start tall a long line down to the line curl and off cross it
j	a long line all the way down to a curled tail and off dot it
f	a short curl then all the way down curl again and off cross it


