Reception Work to support your child at home PHONICS

Below are some examples of how you can support your child at home with their phonics knowledge.

Children learn best with daily practise and by repeating the learning.

You will need your phonic cards that were sent home in your pencil case.

Day 1 – Recap on sounds we have learnt before – *ur* (ur, burn, burp, curl, hurt, surf, turn, tur/nip)

Learn the new sounds –*ow* (now, down, owl, cow, how, bow, pow, row, town, towel and powder)

Practise the tricky word – were (also practise words we have learnt before – (they, one, me, to, you, go, he, she, her, we, are, all, said, when, do, some. So, come)

What does each word mean? Do you notice any patterns? (write a list to show which words have the **ow** sound at the beginning, middle and end).

Choose a book from **Bug Club use either the red or yellow band.**

Can you look at the front cover and talk about what you think might happen in the story?

Does this book remind you of any other stories you know?

Which tricky words did you read in your book?

Work to support your child at home-LITERACY

Day 1-

This week's sentences to learn are:

- Practise <u>saying</u> the sentences- Put your actions to the sentences above as we do in class. Act out the sentences.
- Once you have practised saying the sentences together, see if your child can now remember the sentences and say them without your support. If they can, it means they are ready to write them tomorrow!

Work to support your child at home- Maths - Time

Information for parents

Children order important times of the day and use positional language to describe when events happen e.g. now, before, soon, after and next. They start to develop a sense of time and use the vocabulary yesterday, today and tomorrow to describe when relative events happen. Children will then progress to measure time in simple ways like how may sleeps to an event or a simple timer to measure a duration of an event. When talking about the day children will use language: morning afternoon evening.


