Phonics

This week we are learning the new sound 'o' and today we are going to have a go at using our 'o' along with the other sounds we know to make some words. (To see this activity in action, please check Mrs Patton's Twitter @devnursery) Start by writing the sounds you know on post-its or small pieces of paper, remember we have learnt the following:

**s t p n g and the vowels a i and o**

Now we are going to put 3 of these sounds together to make a word (make sure you put a vowel in the middle to increase the chances of finding real words.) Now sound out the words you make and decide if they are real words or not.

For example:

s o t (not real)

t a p (real)

o i t (not real)




Maths
