Walk forward and stop at the road junction.

The shop that you are visiting is now on your right. The shop is the _____ shop.

Can you write your own directions so that the dog can get to the puppies or the cat can get to the kitten?

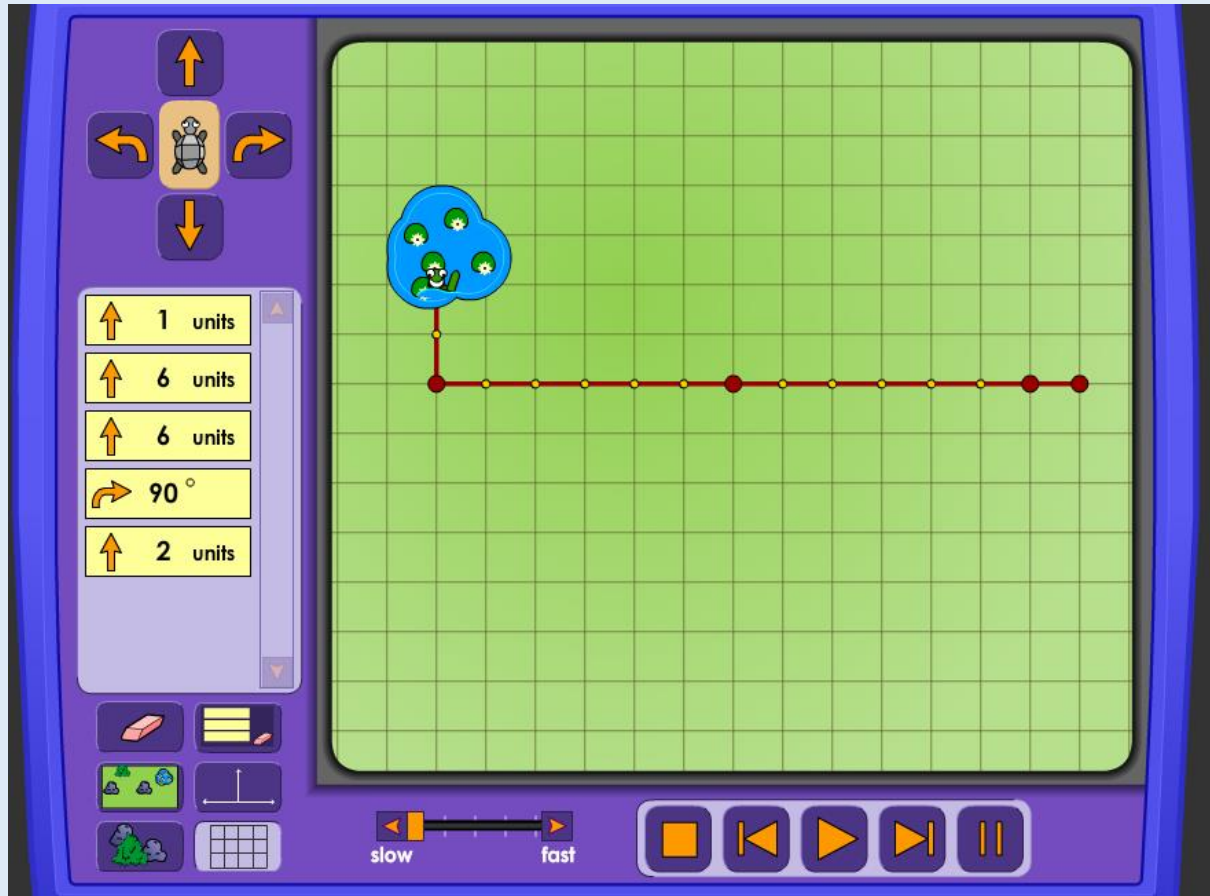
Remember to say where you are starting and which way you are facing.

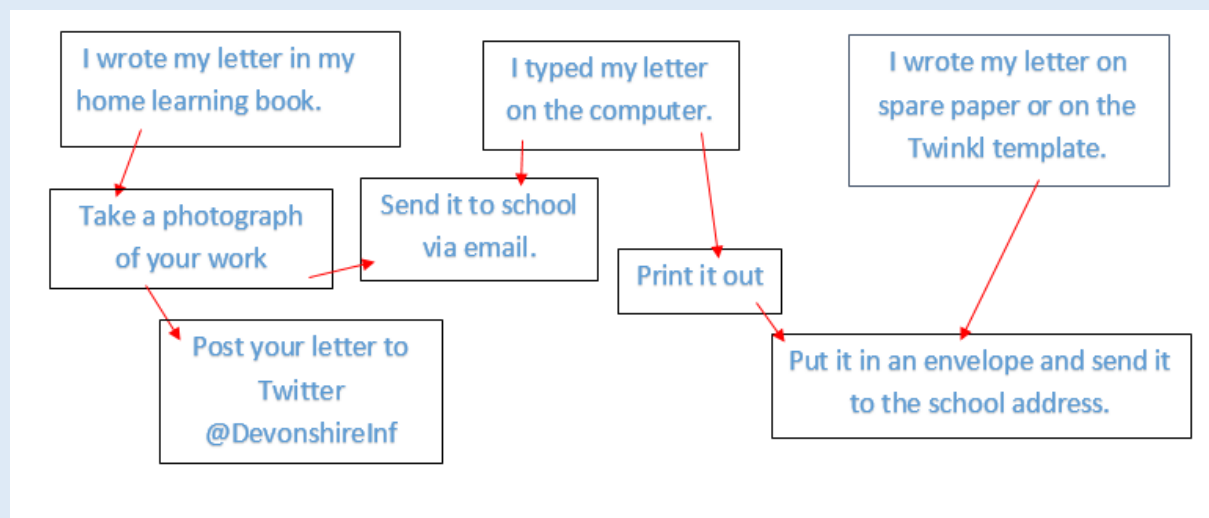
ENGLISH Friday 3.7.2020

EXTRA GOLDEN TIME TASKS (FUN TIME!)

This looks like a very exciting experiment to do.

Can you find out which biscuit can be dunked the most without breaking?



You will need:

- 3 different types of biscuits
- Mug or glass big enough to dunk the biscuits in
- Tap water
- Access to the YouTube soundtrack

Instructions:

1. Listen to the YouTube video so you know what to do.
2. Fill your glass or mug with tap water- remember to keep it the same for each biscuit.
3. With the soundtrack playing, dunk half of the biscuit into the water when you hear a number. The other half should be dry. When you hear 'out' take the biscuit out.

4. Hold the biscuit horizontally above the glass. When you hear the next number, dunk the biscuit back in.
5. When the biscuit breaks, record the 'dunk number'.
6. Repeat the process for all 3 biscuits. Make sure you get fresh water for each biscuit and keep the amount of water the same.
7. Write up your results in a table as you complete the experiment.
8. This is a national challenge so you can submit your results here! <https://fun-science.org.uk/bigexperimentresults/>
9. Write a short conclusion explaining what you have found out.
