




Today you are going to be identifying key features of an action scene.

Maths -




Can I subtract from a 2-digit number when an exchange is needed?

In the context of maths, exchanging means trading or swapping one value for an equivalent (equal) amount.

The exchange needs to be fair so the amounts need to be equal.

Click the picture of the ten stick to have a go playing with hundreds tens and ones. If you aren't able to use the internet then you can make bundles of ten using things from around the house, toothpicks, cotton buds, pencils. Then you can un-bundle them to see how they were made of ten ones.
