





The best way to practise telling the time is to keep looking at clocks around your house. Talk lots about what time you are having dinner or what time your favourite TV programme is on.

Cut out and match the correct time to each analogue or digital clock.






Here is a fun online game to keep playing through the holidays to practise telling the time.




RED HOT CHALLENGE



Can you start to learn how to read quarter to and quarter past times on clocks?






