left right in front of behind under


on top of in between inside outside


Use these words to describe where the teddy is. Is there more than one answer?








Can you put three of your toys in a line and say which is to the left or the right of the middle toy?


You can also put coins in a row and say which coin is to the left or the right. Can you try this challenge?


